We had just sat down to enjoy the meal. The young adolescent guest on my left had taken much care with her outfit and was enjoying the chance to be grown up. I offered to pour her a glass of water. The water trickled in and then with a whoosh, the lid of the jug fell off and a litre of water poured over the table and into the lap of the young guest. It snaked its way around the platters (thankfully not into them) and under placemats. Much mopping and dabbing and sponging ensued. The food was okay. The guest was sodden. I was mortified.

Welcome to Term Four

On behalf of the College, I extend a very warm welcome to our newest families who joined the Secondary School this week. We wish you a happy and positive transition to ILC and we look forward to getting to know you as the term progresses. As we enter the final quarter of the academic year, we are again

expecting a very productive term with not much time to rest, but certainly plenty to enjoy! As such, I encourage you to access the fortnightly newsletter to gain information on current and upcoming events.

Winter/Summer Uniform Change Over

A reminder that we have made the change over from winter to summer uniform as of this week. This means that boys need only wear the College tie for formal occasions, and that our senior boys (Years 10-12) may wear the College dress shorts in place of long trousers. Hats remain a compulsory uniform requirement for students always and the sports uniform is to be changed into at school only (i.e. not worn to and from school). Students must also be prepared to meet our dress and appearance standards with reference to hair, make-up, jewellery and all required uniform items.

Term Time Absence

As we commence Term Four, I ask that students are ready to continue learning and to attend school as required. Any absence during school time is to be applied for in writing. An application form is available from the Secondary School Office to facilitate the request prior to arrangements being made. Neither the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority nor the College recognise family holidays as a legitimate reason for an adjustment to assessment due dates. Therefore, any term-time absence without approved reasons is likely to disadvantage students.

Many thanks to all families who delivered our Year 11 students to the College at 7.00am on Monday for their departure to Moreton Island.
