From the Principal

Dear Parents

A warm welcome to Week 3.

The school year has commenced with a great deal of excitement, and classes are in full swing. It would be a rare year indeed if there were not some 're-adjustments' needed as students negotiate the constraints of school life, following an extended holiday break. I sense that most students have settled in well, with genuine efforts being made to get the year off on a good footing. Many students I have spoken to are pleased to be back and looking forward to a positive year.

A new year is full of new experiences. For example, our Year 10 students at Mt Binga are already deeply immersed in new experiences. Similarly, children new in Prep have had to adjust to being with a group of other children in a learning community. They will be learning valuable lessons about interacting with others, sharing, and respecting each other.

There can be some tears and upsets at the beginning of the school year, especially as new students encounter a different environment and the need to establish new friendships.

Entering a new community can be daunting, even for adults. Just think back to when you were new to a job or club. Coping strategies are acquired through such life changes or transition stages as they are sometimes called. Sociologists even give a name to such events - they speak of rites of passage.

Changing schools is a rite of passage, as are major events such as graduation, starting work, marriage etc. As parents, it is not easy to cope when our child is upset or anxious, but often it is such experiences that help young children and teenagers learn resilience, an important ingredient in becoming independent.

The Rite Journey

Speaking of Rites of Passage, the College will continue with the Rite Journey program for Year 9 students this year. The Rite Journey is a personal self-development program, offered in gender-specific settings and designed to support adolescents to grow into self-aware, responsible, respectful and resilient adults. The year-long program focuses on raising young people's consciousness about transitioning from child to adulthood. This is done both by having conversations about what matters, as well as using a framework of Rite of Passage to make this important developmental shift more experiential. It will be offered as part of the College's Christian Studies program.

On Friday 19 February, the first two ritual celebrations will formally mark the beginning of the year for this group "The Calling" and "The Departure". Department of Education and Training

Consistent with previous years and following the 2016 Australian Bureau of Statistics National Census of Population and Housing, the Department of Education and Training has requested that we provide them with a Statement of Addresses in accordance with the *Australian Education Regulation 2013*. The data requested includes:

- Students' residential address (not student names or other identifying information)
- Students' level of education (whether the student is receiving primary or secondary education)
- Names and residential addresses of the student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s).

Make Caring Common

Caring or successful? Which would you choose for your child? Fortunately, the two aims aren't mutually exclusive, but it's an interesting question. Are you more likely to encourage kindness or effort in your child? Are you more likely to recognise a child's words of encouragement to a sibling or their clever turn of phrase?

I suspect most parents rank a sense of caring for others as a high priority. Few parents want to raise a mean-spirited, self-centred child with little empathy or care for the welfare of others. But looking out for others doesn't come easily to all children, particularly when families are small and child-centric.

Author Anthony D'Angelo wrote, "Without a sense of caring, there can be no sense of community." Families and schools are better places when care takes priority over attainment. Both are toxic when caring for others is not valued or encouraged. Caring for others sits with community development and individual competency as essential leadership qualities to develop in children and young people.

Caring is a higher-level quality that needs nurturing. It doesn't always occur naturally. Studies have shown that caring is kick started earlier in children who belong to large families presumably because children are put in a position to care for and look out for siblings in quasi-parenting roles. Being raised in small families doesn't deny altruism development in kids. It does mean that you may need to work a little harder to awaken caring in your child.

"Mum? I've broken down on the Westgate Freeway. There is no shoulder and I'm still in the car. I'm okay but can you help me work out what to do?"

My daughter had done all the right things, but I was somewhat thrown by the fact that I hadn't anticipated this. I hadn't guessed that she would so quickly live two states away and almost overnight have need to navigate a major city and a multilane freeway as a pandemic shut down public transport.

If I had, I might have applied a different lens to her driving lessons. We would have gone more places, driven in wilder weather and found an eight-lane highway to practise on. If I had, I would not have been so focused on keeping her 'safe for now'. I would have sought more varied experiences which would grow her capacity to keep herself safe in the future, in situations beyond my ken.

The point is that our kids will live through things we cannot predict – pandemics, global warming, heartbreaks, promotions, tragedies and joys. We can be pulled by the urge to maintain safety/happiness/peace in the present moment and lose our grip on an important calling, allowing them to face challenges now so that they can grow their capacity to manage their own safety/happiness/peace in the future.

As it turned out, within minutes of her call, my daughter and her car were plucked from the freeway by a highway response unit with tow trucks, flashing arrows and fluorescent cones. She was promptly whisked off down a dirt access road to a safe spot nearby to wait for RACV – a reminder that things often work out better than we think they might, and that support is never far away!

2020 Academic Excellence Award Presentations

With the introduction of the ATAR system, results for our subject awards, academic excellence awards and Dux of the College were unable to be determined until after the close of the school year. 2020 saw some exceptional results for our graduates with 18% achieving an ATAR above 95, 31% achieving an ATAR above 90 and 65% achieving an ATAR above 80. In addition to this, 100% of students received a Queensland Certificate of Education, with twenty-five students completing a Certificate II and above, including a number at Diploma and Certificate IV level. Last week, we came together to celebrate the academic success of 2020 across all cohorts, and were delighted to have some of our graduates return to receive their awards. We wish them all the very best as they embark on their post-school adventures.

Year 11 RYDA Program (22 February)

Year 11 students will be attending the Roadsafe Youth Driver Awareness (RYDA) Program on Monday 22 February. RYDA is a series of practical and powerful workshops that challenge young people to change the way they think about road safety. It is designed around the concept that they are approaching that crucial time in their lives where they start to drive independently or are travelling as passengers of novice drivers. RYDA focuses on cognition development, building and increasing social competency and resilience, and motivating low risk behaviour. Facilitators work with students to develop and practise personalised strategies and life skills which will help them respond positively to challenges on the road, both as drivers and as highly influential passengers. On the day itself, students will be transported to and from the venue by bus. They will also be required to wear full school uniform and to bring morning tea, lunch and a water bottle. Year 10 Work Experience Request (14-18 June)

At the end of Term Two, Year 10 students will complete a compulsory work experience placement as a part of their Careers Unit. Work experience provides an opportunity for students to sample potential vocational pathways by participating in a typical 'week on the job'. As a result, they can discover their own likes or dislikes within their chosen area of interest and then relate this to their future course of study. Some of the fields explored have included physiotherapy law, business, veterinary science, carpentry, allied health, information technology, avionics, engineering pathways, advertising, journalism, health sciences, education, media and much more. Independent District and Regional Sports Trials

The process for student nomination for both District and Regional Sports Trials requires online nomination for a specific sport, which must be **completed 7 days prior to the trial date. Late nominations will not be accepted under any circumstances.**

Students and parents can access all District trial information via the SCISSA website – www.scissa.asn.au. Follow the links under the District header.

1. The nomination process begins with the student seeing either Mr Harris or Mr Bradforde in the Sports Stadium Office to collect information about their specific sport trials, well before the listed nomination due date.
2. Parents will need to log onto the online platform of the SCISSA Organisation at www.scissa.asn.au to register themselves and their child. The online process is straight forward. Confirmation of your son/daughter's nomination will follow. There is no cost to trial for District teams.
3. District Team nominations closing dates – 13 to 19 years <https://scissa.asn.au/trial-info-secondary/>
4. District Team nomination closing dates – 10 to 12 years <https://scissa.asn.au/trial-info-primary/>
5. A team list will be sent to the school's Head of Sport 24 hours after the trial.
