Last week I felt disappointed by a turn of events. Disappointment is a confusing mix of things – sadness, envy, discouragement. It is one of my least favourite emotions. I'm not sure why exactly but I suspect it has something to do with its sudden nature. Perhaps it is also to do with my failure to see it coming.

As a parent, my own aversion to disappointment means that I have a well-developed capacity to over-protect my offspring from potential disappointment, much like Bryce's Dad in the Muriel's Wedding Musical (listen here <https://vimeo.com/391097820>). Bryce's dad advises:

"Don't go getting your hopes up,

They will be dashed, your dreams will be smashed up,

Best avoid disappointment,

Hope is a rash, pessimism's the ointment."

I have been known to advise similarly. It turns out though, that Bryce's dad was wrong. Hope rather than pessimism is the ointment. Encouraging our kids to be optimistic builds resilience. Experiencing disappointment gives them valuable experience in managing difficult emotions and increases their chances of bouncing back when things don't go to plan.

Maggie Dent notes that "Accepting, understanding and even appreciating the role disappointment can play in raising a competent, confident, resilient child" is extremely important. 

Enrolling for Cocurricular Music Lessons

- Cocurricular Music lessons are charged at the recommended minimum tuition fee advised by the MTAQ. Individual half-hour lessons are available at \$37.00. Group lessons are \$25/lesson. The College has aligned its rates with other local colleges to continue to attract excellent staff and reinforce the vision for Cocurricular Music at Immanuel meeting and surpassing excellence in music education.
