We are one of only a few schools that focus on P to 12 family engagement. In the past couple of years, I have seen everything from a sprightly octogenarian sing nursery rhymes through to a retired physicist invited to 'take over' a senior science class. It is a blessing to us all.

Rim Road

A member of our community, who lives near the College on Rim Road, has called with concerns about driver behaviour in the area. She reported cars travelling in the wrong direction, overtaking unsafely etc. at school drop-off and pick-up time. I am sure these are not the actions of a school parent, but we need to highlight our concerns. I have spoken to our QPS Liaison Officer and they will be extending their presence in the area.

When Kids Need a Parental Push

Watching your child or young person manage their nervous moments can be challenging for parents, but it comes with the territory. How you react to an anxiety-inducing moment can influence the way kids approach uncomfortable situations in the future.

Sadly, avoidance is a well-entrenched pattern of behaviour that holds many kids back from experiencing life as they would like. The comfort zone that many crave to stay in can be like maximum security prison where there's no escape. It's incumbent upon parents to make sure participation rather than avoidance becomes

the most likely response even when kids feel nervous and tense.

Holding firm in the face of resistance

Recently, Melanie, a mother of four, told me how she approached her teenage daughter's nervousness about taking a part-time job. Fifteen-year-old Chloe, a quiet, thoughtful, studious girl, wanted a job but was too nervous to go for an interview. Melanie took a firm stance with her daughter and insisted that she go for the job interview, despite some incredibly strong resistance.

Melanie said, "I drove Chloe to the interview. She was so nervous that she was shaking. As we got closer, Chloe begged me not to make her do it. I felt so sorry for her, but I wouldn't let her off the hook. I knew that if she wouldn't do this then she'd always avoid the things that make her nervous. I told her that there was no option. This is something she had to do."

Chloe was successful with the job interview. The first thing she did when she got home was to thank Melanie for holding her ground and insisting that she go for the interview.

Making decisions in a child's best interests

There's a natural tendency for kids to avoid doing activities where they may fail, struggle or even risk being laughed at. At such times, parents who can see the bigger picture need to make decisions for their child to prevent the development of negative patterns of behaviour that are so difficult to break. It takes significant parental sensitivity and courage to avoid taking anxiety-inducing activities temporarily away from a child or teenager. But it's the right thing to do if developing a child's confidence, rather than their feelings of helplessness, is your goal.

Melanie's daughter still feels nervous before she goes to work, but the nerves are getting less each time. Importantly, her courage account is being filled along with her bank account each time she heads off to work. You should never underestimate the value of a little parenting push, particularly if anxiety tends to be your child's constant companion.

This week I have had my girl home (longer than expected after a sneaky Mother's Day surprise). Usually when she is home, we cram a lot in. This time we are both working, and, by necessity, we are content with doing the essentials. As I write, she sits opposite me at the table, wire framed glasses, heat pack in her lap. We share a bowl of soy crisps. Our fingers reach for the snacks more than they reach for our computer keys.

We talk about her assignment and what I should write this week. She suggests I open a book on the table randomly to a page and use it as 'inspo'. On page 176 of *Inner Sky*, Mari Andrew writes "We reward action with the valued word 'brave' but inaction can be its own kind of bravery too". I try again, looking for something easier. My girl says this is cheating.

Thus, committed to pondering inaction, I consider our lack of rushing this past week. I think about the rhythms and rituals of home which sustain us. The quiet ways of being to which we easily return, picking up the hum of shared years. Whilst we often recall big things we have done (astounding now that we once travelled across the globe), it is the small things, the 'inactions' that have lasted. Pottering in the kitchen while she studies, market bread on a Saturday morning, sea-glass on the windowsill, cups of tea, shared music and humour.

It can be brave to resist the outstanding, in favour of the ordinary. It can be brave to trust, as we parent, that the fabric on which we rest our children's lives is more important than the decorative cushions of special events. Research tells us that many of our memories about childhood are the routines and rituals that happen over and again, unremarkable, reliable and (if we are intentional) nourishing.

The snack bowl empty, our computer keys chatter in the quiet of the afternoon. I pause to capture this ordinary, extraordinary moment in all its detail. Come the week's end my daughter will be gone. I am trusting the quiet inaction of home to fortify her as the world beckons onwards.

Grooming

Parents are reminded of the need to ensure that student grooming and the wearing of uniforms are in line with College expectations (See College Handbook).

Particularly, we would draw your attention to the following areas:

- Boys' and Girls' hair is to be kept clean, neat and tidy, off the face; of natural appearance, **not dyed, tinted or bleached**. Boys' hair should be off the collar and fifty percent off the ears.
- Black leather shoes should be plain, conventional lace-up and well maintained.
- Students **may not** wear any makeup at any time.
- Girls may wear gold or silver studs or sleepers **only**.
- Exemption requests for items of uniform that are not available for a period can be made in writing to your child's teacher or the Primary School Administration.

Casual Clothes Day – Light Up Vanuatu

Immanuel Lutheran College Primary School is holding a Casual Clothes Day on Friday 21 May to support the **2021 Light Up Vanuatu campaign**.

Students in Years P to 6 are asked to **wear bright colours** to symbolise light and Years P to 5 children are asked to bring a **generous donation** on the day. Year 6 children are already raising money through undertaking jobs at home.

Each light costs \$35.00 and as a College our goal is to buy and assemble 100 lights to help end light poverty for children in Vanuatu. Monies raised will go directly towards the purchase of solar lights for these students in Vanuatu.

We have registered for the **Light Up Vanuatu** campaign with the Independent Primary School Heads of Australia (IPSHA) and *Solar Buddy*, to help end energy poverty for all the 47,000 children currently living in extreme energy poverty in Vanuatu.

Year 6 students will assemble them as part of their project-based learning program in Term Three. College staff are going to assemble lights during our upcoming Staff Spiritual Retreat Day in late June. Children and staff will also write personal letters to each recipient of the lights assembled. These solar lights will be distributed to children in Vanuatu in November 2021.

Students participating in our casual clothes day are expected to wear **school appropriate casual clothes**, including acceptable length shorts, skirts, closed in shoes and no midriff tops. Casual clothes will also need to meet the Immanuel Lutheran College Sun Safety Policy including covered shoulders, broad brimmed hats and enclosed shoes.

A donation bucket will also be located at Primary School Administration for those families who would be willing to donate more for this wonderful cause.

Enrolling for Cocurricular Music Lessons

- To assist parents to know whether it is worthwhile for their child to learn a musical instrument, or which instrument to learn, a Music Aptitude Test is available. Please phone the College Main Administration on T: 5477 3444 and ask to speak to the Cocurricular Music Coordinator.
- Cocurricular Music lessons are charged at the recommended minimum tuition fee advised by the MTAQ. Individual half-hour lessons are available at \$37.00. Group lessons are \$25/lesson. The College has aligned its rates with other local colleges to continue to attract excellent staff and reinforce the vision for Cocurricular Music at Immanuel meeting and surpassing excellence in music education.
