Remembrance Day

Australian Business Week (ABW) Enterprise Education

We are excited about our involvement in the upcoming Australian Business Week (ABW) Enterprise Education from 22 - 26 November.

The ABW program incorporates a computer-simulated business environment, along with practical components of producing trade displays, promotional videos, company reports and oral presentations. In the safety of a virtual world, our Year 10 students will assume management roles in running a hotel chain and make decisions that affect business performance over eight quarters of company growth. The program will replace the student's regular curriculum for one week.

Due to the experiential nature of the learning, it promotes valuable skills, including teamwork, responsibility, decision-making skills and boosting confidence. Secondary School students are on the cusp of adult life, but often a very long way from having the skills and confidence they need to negotiate life as an adult. ABW can have a tremendous impact on these students, allowing them to sample the business world in a mature role, creating a memorable and enjoyable learning experience.

At the successful completion of the week, including attendance every day, and involvement in the program, students will gain one credit towards their Queensland Certificate of Education. We are grateful for the support from prominent Sunshine Coast business leaders and supporters of the College, who will join us throughout the week as Business Mentors and Speakers and join us on Friday for the Awards Ceremony.

How much do you know about your children's online life? Recent studies have shown that most parents think they know quite a lot. Studies also show that parents significantly underestimate the level of violence and sexualised content children are exposed to.

Trying to keep up with the latest apps, games and other content is like herding cats – the online world changes rapidly. Studies vary in their estimates but some figures which have been published suggest that by the age of 18, young people view 200,000 violent images. A study completed in 2005 found that half of children aged 9 to 16 have viewed pornography. We might assume the figure is much higher in 2021. All of this can be daunting for parents, and it can be easy to throw our hands up in the air and decide that the horse has bolted (to use another animal metaphor).

We cannot, however, afford to be ostrich like and bury our heads in the sand (that's three!). Studies have shown that children's brains are highly susceptible to violent images. Children are likely to become more fearful, less empathic and more aggressive as a result of viewing violent content. It has been found that brain structure is altered with exposure to violence, with decreased activity in the frontal cortex and similar patterns of brain activity to that of children who have been diagnosed with behavioural disorders.

So, what to do? There is no magic wand here. As parents we must do the work. Stay updated and informed about current trends, especially how seemingly safe platforms can include references and excerpts of violent or sexualised content (Netflix series, Squid Game and its capacity to have crossed onto various platforms in a range of forms is a current example of this). Supervise children's online time. Don't ignore the elephant in the room and let curiosity kill our kittens – get involved and get talking with your kids (and that is four and five!).

World Interact Week – Casual Dress Day

World Interact Week is celebrated every year around 5 November to commemorate the founding of the first Interact club in 1962. Mt Binga 2022 – Information Evening (10 November)

We are looking forward to meeting with Year 9 families next week for the 2022 Mt Binga Information Evening. This will take place on Wednesday 10 November from 6.30pm in the Ken Thamm Centre Lecture Theatre. The evening will also be attended by Head of Mt Binga, Mr David Scheffe who will discuss what can be expected from this very special outdoor education experience.

Year 12 Final Week Arrangements

Year 12 students are steadily working through their final exams and are fast nearing the end of their formal schooling. The next three weeks remain very important for them both academically and with regard to their graduation celebrations. Following on from the external assessment period, their final week will be filled with several memorable events:

Monday 15 November -Year 12 students are not required at school on this day.

Tuesday 16 November - Year 12 Celebration Day – this will be inclusive of the annual car wash event, Open Mic, and water activities. Students will require their day uniform and bathers/towel/sunscreen etc.

Wednesday 17 November - Year 12 students will be immersed in a number of long-standing College traditions such as Cutting the Net, The Year 12 Morning Tea for Staff, and House Farewells. They will need to wear their House uniform on this day and will require their device (very important!). These events are for students only (i.e. parents are not required to attend).

Thursday 18 November - Secondary School Awards Assembly from 1.30pm to 2.45pm at the LifePoint Baptist Church (186 Wisers Road). During this time, Year 12 students will also receive their graduation certificate and will be announced formally as our Class of 2021. This event may be attended by Year 12 students and their parents only.

Friday 19 November - Valedictory Day. Year 12 students will be required at school at 8.00am on this day for a cohort breakfast. As with tradition, the Walk of Faith will start from the Lecture Theatre at 9.00am, and will lead to the celebration in the Worship Centre. Year 12 students who drive to school will be provided with special parking along the oval side of the bus turnaround. Parent parking will be available outside the Worship Centre and on the College Green - staff will be at both areas early on this day to assist as guides.

Again, this event will be for Year 12 students and their parents only. It will be live streamed for extended family and others in the College Community to enjoy. A link to the live-stream will be sent closer to the time.

Year 10 Australian Business Week (22-26 November)

Year 10 students will be involved in a business simulation program called ABW (Australian Business Week) during Week 8. The ABW program is designed to encourage independent and cooperative learning skills and to develop an enterprise mindset prior to entering the workforce or proceeding to further study. Students will be divided into teams and will spend the week:

- Managing a business through a computer simulation.
- Learning from guest speakers from business and the community.
- Developing a new product of their own invention.
- Creating a video and trade display to advertise that product.
- Delivering a verbal and written report of the week's activities.
- Interacting with business people and teachers as facilitators.

Each team will compete against the others to operate a business simulation over a two-year period. To succeed, students learn all the basics of business operation from profit and loss through to planning and marketing. On the last day there will be a trade display by all the companies. The program is an intensive learning experience which aims to be challenging, enjoyable and very rewarding for all involved. I thank our community mentors who have offered their time and experience to assist our students during the week.

Year 7-9 Final Week Program

From Monday 29 November to Wednesday 1 December all students in Years 7 to 9 will participate in an alternative program that will aim to maximise teaching and learning opportunities, whilst also providing meaningful and enjoyable activities to conclude the year. These three days will see them complete their final exams in some core subjects, and will include important assessment tasks for the year. As such attendance is compulsory. All academic achievement is an end-of-year standard and students will be adversely affected if they do not complete these assessments. Additionally, exams cannot be completed before the scheduled time. Should this be an issue for any reason, you are asked to contact the Secondary School Office.

Wellbeing

We live in a society where alcohol forms the basis of many social interactions. It's no wonder that a common question asked by many parents is, "when do I let my kids have a drink?". We all know that for most and at some stage in their life, they will give alcohol a go... We want to be in a position of informing their choices and helping to reduce their risks.



While Year 11 students have started exploring alcohol and its associated risk during their Life Skills lessons, Year 12 students recently experienced a presentation from the Red Frogs. Their session was geared towards preparing them for a safe passage during their upcoming Schoolies celebrations. However, education around alcohol is not just limited to those who can, or will soon be able to, legally consume it. In fact, we know it's an important conversation to have earlier in the family home, particularly around family values and safety. We hope the Dr Michael Carr-Gregg and SchoolTV information below is helpful.

A SPECIAL REPORT: Having the Alcohol Discussion

With the impending festive season and end of school celebrations, some teenagers may be feeling ready to party, wanting to put the disruptions, frustrations and disappointments of this past year, behind them.

To ensure our young people stay safe during this time, parents and carers are encouraged to have the alcohol discussion - no matter how difficult or overwhelming it may be. It is important to outline the rules and boundaries around age-appropriate alcohol consumption and what the legal implications may be.

Young people are at greater risk of alcohol-related harm than adults because their brains continue to develop until their mid-twenties. The safest level of alcohol consumption for teenagers, is no alcohol at all, but this may be difficult to enforce and may not prevent them from experimenting. However, parents and carers can influence sensible drinking habits and help minimise the risks.

In this Special Report, a series of discussion points are offered to help make the conversation about alcohol consumption a little easier.

We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this Special Report, and as always, we welcome your feedback.
