## College Counsellor

Have you ever had that frustrating experience of knowing that you are right about something and having someone blatantly tell you that you are wrong, even when the facts are staring you both in the face? Some people will even dispute that the sky is blue.

In fact, there is a tribe called the Himba for whom the sky is never blue. The Himba have no word for blue. They have no stories pertaining to the colour of the sky and its shade has never been given a name. Almost unbelievably, as a result, for the Himba the sky does not have a colour at all. The Himba, who rely on the bush for their survival, can pick variances in shades of green which are imperceptible to our western eyes. They cannot, however, pick a blue square from the midst of a group of green squares, something which is immediately obvious to us.

Neuroscientists believe that, in some ways which we don't yet fully understand, language literally shapes the way we see the world. It may be that without a word to describe something our brain does not see it, or that we see things the same way, but without a word for it, we fail to notice it.

What can we take from this remarkable situation? Firstly, the stories we tell ourselves and our children shape our lives. The words we use matter. They may change our brains and our lives in ways we are unaware of. Secondly, facts are not always black and white. They may be blue or shades of green. These are encouragers for us to let curiosity over-ride frustration, to ask rather than tell. May Term Three offer many opportunities for us to be open to the wisdom we gain by seeing the colours of the world through the eyes of others.

### Morning Program

In the Primary School, our morning program begins at 8.30am across Years P to 6. Classes will generally be involved in Devotion, the Roll, Reading Groups and general housekeeping matters prior to commencing the first formal lessons of the day. It is important that all students are at school on time each day so that these sessions are not missed. Please ensure your child is at school by 8.25am ready to learn. School finishes for all Primary School year levels at 3.00pm.

### Grooming

Parents are reminded of the need to ensure that grooming and the wearing of uniforms are in line with the College expectations (See College Handbook). It is often easy to let our standards slip during the Winter months when an extra layer may be required.

Particularly, we would draw your attention to the following areas:

- Boys' and Girls' hair is to be kept clean, neat and tidy, off the face; of natural appearance, not dyed, tinted or bleached. Boys' hair should be short.
- Black leather shoes should be plain, conventional lace-up and well maintained.
- Students may not wear any make-up at any time.
- Girls may wear gold or silver studs or sleepers only.
- Students may not wear 'skins' under sports uniform or normal College uniform.

Our students have a responsibility to uphold the ethos of the College, and to show pride in their College by wearing the uniform correctly – both at the College and when in the community. Your support in this regard is greatly appreciated.

### What happens if I cannot attend a lesson?

### Performance Uniform Expectations

To improve the visual presentation of Symphonic Band, Stage Band, College Chorale, Immanuel's Vocal Ensemble, Vivace String Ensemble, Flute Ensemble and Brass Ensemble, students in these ensembles are required to wear a College blazer as part of their performance uniform from Term Two to Term Four each year.
