

College Counsellor

Recently I have been learning to crochet. It has given me much pleasure to learn a new skill and to create items for my loved ones (my pleasure may outweigh theirs, I suspect!).

The weekend just gone I spent more hours than I had at my disposal deciphering my very first actual pattern. Up until now, I have learnt a stitch from YouTube and repeated it until the item stretches into either a scarf or a blanket. I made a handsome start on the project.

Monday morning I had wings on my feet, excited to show off my cleverness to my crochet tutor - patient, pedantic and a master of yarn. My buoyancy was short lived. Eagle eyes spotted a flaw at one hundred paces. The very first row was a stitch too far to the right and 'must be redone'. The offending row was underneath 25 perfect rows. To my mind, no one would notice (I certainly hadn't!). No matter declared crochet Yoda, 'you will know it is wrong and you won't ever be happy with it. You must do this to truly understand crochet'.

I sighed with my daughter over the unpicking before me. 'You could unpick it. Or you could just learn to live with the imperfection, I guess'.

True that, isn't it? To settle the matter, I asked another crochet veteran to provide the litmus test. Yarn master #2 was either very diplomatic or really couldn't find the error. Satisfied, I have continued on with the flaw intact . . . 49 rows and counting.

While I am not (yet) a yarn master, I am working towards and am happy to balance the joy of the process with the (teeny tiny!!) imperfection of the outcome.

As we begin our planning for next year, parents are reminded to advise the College if their child/ren will not be returning to ILC in 2023.



Class Placements Years 1-6 / 2023

As previously mentioned, we will soon begin the complex process of allocating students to their 2023 classes. Many factors are taken into account when considering each child's placement. These include student learning needs, gender balance, class target size and friendship groups.

Teachers have considerable input into this process and will make suggestions related to the various needs of the children in their current classes. Each child will have an opportunity to list a small number of friends with whom they believe they can work positively. We guarantee that each child will be with at least one of the children on their shortlist, but not necessarily their first choice.

Primary School staff will use all this information in combination with the previously mentioned factors to place children into classes for next year. Draft lists will be rechecked by the teaching staff alongside Katrina Riley, Tim French and myself to ensure that each student is placed in the best situation to meet their educational needs.

Should parents wish to submit specific written information regarding their child's particular needs, please ensure this reaches me by 4.00pm Friday 16 September via email bondl@immanuel.qld.edu.au.

I ask that your request relates only to your child's needs and not to the naming of specific teachers. Please do not pass verbal requests to teachers as only written requests following the process above can be considered.

It is not possible to balance many requests for one child when considering all the other children in a year level. For this reason, I ask that you limit your request to a single specific issue. In addition, given that there are many factors to be considered when placing students, it may not be possible to accommodate all parent requests.

Please understand that it is not necessary for parents to write to me, and in fact, most parents do not. Parents will be advised of 2023 class placements prior to our Orientation Morning at the end of Term Four.

Year 12 External Assessment Preparation

To assist Year 12 students prepare for their external assessments, they will be sitting a series of mock exams over the course of this week and next. Although these practice examinations are formative, and will not contribute to subject grades, they will provide a valuable learning opportunity prior to the real external examinations that will take place from Week 4 in Term Four. Teachers will use student responses to provide feedback to identify areas for improvement and have emphasised the importance of preparing well for the Practice Exams so that maximum benefit can be gained from this feedback. The papers will also allow students to:

- revise and test subject knowledge.
- familiarise themselves with the language of external assessment, the types of questions that might be asked and the expected length of responses.
- experience external assessment conditions and practise relevant skills.
- build their confidence and ability in sitting exams.

Year 12 students are to be commended for the hard work, dedication, and commitment they have demonstrated towards their final academic year. We wish them all the very best during this important time.



Year 11 Examination Block

Year 11 students have worked through Units 1 and 2 this year and completed the internal assessments for each of their subjects. The final assessment will be a practice external examination which will contribute 50% of their Units 1/2 assessment for Mathematics and Science General subjects, and 25% for all other General subjects. As this will be the first dress rehearsal for our Year 11 students re: the QCAA External Examinations at the end of Year 12, the assessments will be conducted formally observing the QCAA protocols. Examinations will be held in the Environmental Centre. Please keep them in your thoughts and prayers during this time.

USC Headstart Information Evening

- Gain QCE points.
- Broaden their education.
- Explore a subject they're interested in before committing to a full degree.
- Receive a subject bonus adjustment (1 rank per course) to be applied to their ATAR score or selection rank.
