

2023 Waseda Primary Visit - Host Families - Expressions of Interest

Next year, Immanuel Lutheran College Primary School will participate in a home stay program involving twenty 11–12-year-old students from Waseda Primary School in Tokyo, Japan.

This visit will occur from Monday 31 July to Sunday 7 August. This program is coordinated by the Brisbane International Academy (BIA) which will contact you in the new year, should you express your interest to be a host family. BIA has both Australian and Japanese staff and information sessions are provided.

It is an extremely rewarding cultural experience for the host family and the children from Japan. Their hope is to stay with an Australian family and experience all the ordinary day to day things these families do. It is a great experience for you and your family.

If you take on the role of host family, you will need to provide a bed for your student, three meals each day, drop off and pick up the students each school day and provide a fun activity on the weekend they are here e.g. a trip to the beach would be a highlight. One of the mutual benefits of the home stay program is that Japanese students have the opportunity to practise their English skills whilst your children are able to experience a different culture.

ILC expects adult members of host families to hold a Blue Card. If you do not hold a Blue Card and would like to host a student, please download the form online from <https://www.bluecard.qld.gov.au/applications/need-to-apply-for-card.html>.

Your application must go through the school so please fill out the form and return it to the Primary Administration Office. This is all free of charge.

Once payment is received, the loan device can then be collected from the KTC at the start of Term One, 2023.

All students who currently have an ILC owned instrument and / or band folders with associated music are asked to return their instrument to KM8 or KTC no later than Monday 27 November. Over the Christmas break we will complete a check of all ILC owned hire instruments and sheet music. This will enable us to make repairs and ensure instruments continue to meet our standards.
