We had a party recently. Gourmet grazing boxes were ordered from a fancy deli. 'Caters for 8-10 people' had left us wondering whether the 8-10 were snacking or feasting. Wanting to ensure that we had ample offerings, the deli was phoned for the measurements of the grazing boxes.

After a wait on hold, the deli assistant declared: "The box is from elbow to fingers wide and from elbow to fingers with a full other set of fingers long".

We thought the measurement amusing but reasonably useful (and ample). As it turned out, the assistant likely had exceptionally short arms and fingers. Forearmed, in this case, was not forewarned.

I got to thinking about 'measuring'. As human beings, we spend our days measuring ourselves – our worth, our 'goodness', our ability, our likeability. We compare ourselves to others and frequently come up with up wanting. Like the deli assistant, we are tempted to use the closest thing to hand (pardon the pun) and measure ourselves against something (someone) that is unreliable or inaccurate.

Measuring ourselves against others is problematic because we have no choice but to compare our own 'inside' with others' 'outside'. Our internal world cannot be accurately measured against the exterior presented to us by others.

Measuring ourselves through the lens of our own chosen values and recognising that even the shiniest of people carry messy insides, will afford us improved accuracy and more importantly, a nourishing serve of self-compassion.

Remembrance Day Observance (10 November)

Next week, Secondary School will attend a Remembrance Day Observance from 11.05am in the A. J. Jericho Stadium. Remembrance Day is a time for us to acknowledge and remember those who served their country and to recognise the responsibility we all have to work for the peace they fought hard to achieve. Year 12 Final Week Arrangements (14-18 November)

As a follow on from their External Assessment block, 2022 Seniors can look forward to a special week in the lead up to their graduation. The program will run as follows:

- **Monday 14 November:** A fun day at Bli Bli Aqua Park from 10.30am. Students will require their own transport to and from the venue and can wear free dress.
- **Tuesday 15 November:** Students are required on campus from 9.00am in the Worship Centre. This day will be inclusive of a Valedictory Service rehearsal, the annual car wash event, Open Mic and water activities. Students will require their day uniform and their bathers.
- **Wednesday 16 November:** Will see a 7.45am departure from the ILC Bus Turnaround for the Year 12 Retreat and 'Cutting the Net' ceremony at Luther Heights. Sports uniform is to be worn.

- **Thursday 17 November:** All will be involved in the Valedictory Service set-up and are required on campus from 9.00am in the Worship Centre. This will then be followed by the Year 12 Student and Staff Morning Tea, House Farewells and the Awards Evening Rehearsal. House Uniform can be worn on this day. On Thursday evening, all Year 12 students are to attend the 2022 Awards Evening from 6.00pm. Formal uniform will be required for this occasion.
- **Friday 18 November:** Year 12 students will be required at school at 7.30am for a cohort breakfast. As with tradition, the Walk of Faith will start from the Lecture Theatre at 9.00am and will lead to the celebration in the Worship Centre. Year 12 students who drive to school will be provided with special parking along the oval side of the bus turnaround. Parent parking will be available outside the Worship Centre and on the College Green – staff will be at both areas early on this day to assist as guides.

Secondary School Awards Evening (17 November)

We are looking forward to presenting our end-of-year awards on Thursday 17 November from 6.00pm at Calvary Christian Church, 212 Crosby Hill Rd, Tanawha. This is a compulsory function for all students in the Secondary School and they are required to wear formal uniform. During this time, Year 12 students will also receive their graduation certificates and be announced formally as our Class of 2022. As it will not be possible to acknowledge Subject Awards and Dux of the College due to the ATAR system, all academic awards will be presented at our Academic Awards Evening on Thursday 2 February 2023.

Year 10 Australian Business Week (21-25 November)

A reminder that all Year 10 students will be involved in the Australian Business Week Enterprise Education program from Monday 21 November to Friday 25 November 2022. The ABW program is designed to encourage independent and cooperative learning skills and to develop an enterprise mindset prior to entering the workforce or proceeding to further study. Students will be divided into teams and will spend the week:

- Managing a business through a computer simulation.
- Learning from guest speakers from business and the community.
- Developing a new product of their own invention.
- Creating a video and trade display to advertise that product.
- Delivering a verbal and written report of the week's activities.
- Interacting with business mentors and teachers as facilitators.

Each team will compete against the others to operate a business simulation over a two-year period. To succeed, students learn all the basics of business operation from profit and loss through to planning and marketing. On the last day there will be a trade display by all the companies. The program is an intensive learning experience which aims to be challenging, enjoyable and very rewarding for all involved. I take this opportunity in advance to thank our community mentors who have offered their time and experience to assist our students during the week.
