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From the Principal

Dear Parents

A warm welcome to Week 1 of the 2023 school year, which promises to be full of excitement and opportunity. A very special welcome to the families of the 200+ students who are new to the College this year. I look forward to meeting many of you on Thursday 9 February, at the New Families Welcome Event on the College Green from 5.30pm to 7.00pm. Invitations and additional information will be emailed to new families shortly.

Welcome Service

Earlier today (Wednesday 25 January), we had a special Years 1-12 Worship to officially commence the year. This included the installation of our new staff and 2023 student leaders.

Academic Outcomes 2022

We would like to acknowledge the outstanding achievements of our 2022 graduates. Even with COVID-19 and remote learning interrupting their schooling in 2020 and 2021, the Class of 2022 had significant success across a wide range of areas and are ready to begin the next stage of their lives.

Graduates from the Class of 2022 will pursue a variety of pathways ranging from degrees in medicine, engineering, mathematics, advanced science, nursing, psychology, visual art, commerce, journalism, music and opportunities in the defence force and workplace. This year, 17 students applied to the University of the Sunshine Coast Early Offer Guarantee Program, and all 17 were offered a place. An additional four were accepted in early entrance programs at RMIT, ANU and QUT. As of today, all students who applied to university have received an offer, with over 85% receiving their first preference. One of the most pleasing results is that 100% of students achieved their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).

Dux Fraser Waddy is pursuing a Bachelor of Medicine / Bachelor of Surgery. Fraser received the College's Dr Matthew Jones UCAT Bursary last year. With an ATAR of 99.45, Fraser hopes to study medicine at either James Cook or Griffith University in 2023.

Artists Libby Evans and Zoe Kamarinos achieved their dream when they were both offered early entrance to RMIT's School of Art, ranked number one in Australia and number 15 in the world for art and design (2021 QS Rankings).

But not all graduates are pursuing an academic pathway. AFL player Hunter Moore is continuing his Certificate IV in Engineering while he trains in the U18 Brisbane Lions Academy with a view to one day playing AFL professionally. In 2022, all students seeking a vocational pathway were successful, including two electrical apprenticeships.

Congratulations to the Class of 2022, and in particular, we thank the teachers and parents for their significant support of our graduates throughout last year. Whatever paths our graduates choose, we're proud that they have the confidence to make their own decisions and choose pathways best suited to their strengths, interests and abilities. We wish them the very best as they embark on this next exciting chapter of their lives.

Interhouse Swimming Carnivals

Family and friends are invited to the Secondary School Interhouse Swimming Carnival on Monday 30 January, at the Nambour Aquatic Centre, Petrie Park Road, Nambour. Events will commence at 9.15am and parents are very welcome and encouraged to attend; however, we have been advised by pool management that an entrance fee of \$2.40 will be charged to spectators upon entry to the pool. We look forward to excellent carnivals to get the sporting year underway. Events will conclude by 2.30pm and students will be back on campus by 3.05pm in time for the close of school.

Farewell Year 10 (Group 1)

On Tuesday 31 January (Week 2), we will farewell Group 1 students on their Mt Binga experience. They have much to look forward to and we, along with their families, anticipate their stories about the hundreds of lessons they will have learnt while at Mt Binga – important lessons about life, living, self, faith, skills, knowledge and relationships.

Voices On the Coast Literature Festival (23 – 25 February)

This year, the annual Voices on the Coast Literature Festival will be held from 23 to 25 February, with the student days being Thursday, 23 and Friday, 24 February. This festival attracts over 4,500 school children from across the Sunshine Coast and hinterland to talk and workshop with leading Australian authors and illustrators.

This year, as we celebrate 28 years of Voices, we will include a family event on the College Green, just outside the library, with the opportunity for families to mix and mingle with the authors and illustrators. There will be short author talks, book sales and book signings. A family extravaganza! Further details will be released soon.

Parent Handbook

School Traffic

Maroochydore Police have asked me to remind all parents to take care when using our roads, especially with students heading back to school. To assist with a safe return to school, they advise that they will conduct traffic patrols around schools, including speed detection in school zones (40km per hour). Parents are also reminded to park in the designated areas to ensure that children are not put at risk by walking onto roadways between parked cars.

I take this opportunity to remind families that there are three Drop 'n' Go zones available for use across the campus. Primary School families are requested to use the zone adjacent to the Worship Centre Car Park. Secondary School families are also welcome to use this zone, though may prefer to utilise the zone adjacent to the Bus Turnaround Area. I would also remind parents that parking is not permitted in the Worship Centre driveways at any time. The third zone exists at the roundabout and adjacent to the Prep Centre near the Rim Road entrance.

Please note that these zones only work efficiently when students alight immediately from the vehicle, which will assist with traffic management. Unless there is an emergency, parents are asked not to get out of vehicles in these zones. While it is acknowledged that the Rim Road entrance presents an ideal alternative, it is our preference for student drop off/pick up to be effected via the Wisers Road entrance. Rim Road is a narrow thoroughfare with restricted access, and I ask parents to observe speed limits and exercise all due care, both in observance of general safety and respect for our neighbours.

We will also keep the College Green open for parking in the morning and afternoon until at least the end of this week. Thank you in advance for your patience at this busy time of year.

Communication

This newsletter, *Immanuel in Touch*, is the primary source of information to our families. We consider it to be of vital importance to all stakeholders in our community. It is certainly a major undertaking by many hands to see it published on a fortnightly basis. Together, with our Learning Management System (SEQTA), College App, Facebook, Instagram, class newsletters and regular mailings, we have many options to stay connected. We are also looking forward to a change in the process to report student absentees, which will soon be lodged through the revised College App. We will send more information out to parents as we work through the trialling stage this term.

Finally, I would like to highlight that Term One will be a very busy time. I encourage students to start well; establish good study and work routines that set them up for the whole year. I invite parents to communicate with class teachers early in the year to discuss strategies and plan for student success.

Again, a warm welcome to all families for 2023. We look forward to sharing a great year together.

Welcome to the 2023 school year! I trust your family enjoyed some quality time together over the holiday season. Particularly, we welcome the many new students to Immanuel, especially our youngest learners starting their school journey in Prep in 2023 - I'm sure you will soon feel connected in our

community. We are really looking forward to this year being another amazing one. We also welcome Miss Cairo Baker (2L), Mr Daniel Keane (P-2 Pastoral Coordinator/1L Teacher), Mrs Leanne Green (Year 2 Teacher Assistant), Mrs Helen Sack (Year 6 Teacher Assistant) and Mrs Amanda McCarthy (Prep C Teacher Assistant) to the College.

During our professional learning sessions over the past couple of weeks, Primary School staff participated in numerous sessions to consolidate our teaching and learning practice, specifically in relation to differentiating the curriculum for our learners.

Parent Information Afternoon – Years P-6

This year's information sessions will be held next Wednesday 1 February with information sent via email regarding session times.

Personal Mobile Devices in the Primary School

A reminder that students in the Primary School do not require access to a mobile device during the school day (8.00am-3.00pm) for contact with parents and care givers. This includes mobile phones and Apple watches which should not be worn at school. Parents are asked to make all contact with students during the day via Student Services T: 5477 3484 who will arrange for messages to be passed to students. Please be aware that change of pick-up arrangements needs to be communicated prior to 2.30pm. Whilst I understand some children carry a mobile device for contact out of school hours for cocurricular commitments, they are not to be used during the school day.

Parking

Traffic at the College is always busy for the first few weeks of the academic year. Primary School drop-off and pick-up points are Rim Road, Aquatic Centre Car Park and the Worship Centre Car Park. The ELC Car Park outside of Main Administration is only for families who have children in the ELC. It is not a drop-off or pick-up area. We would ask our Primary School families not to park in this area.

We thank you for your support in this regard.

Parents who use the Rim Road Car Park would have noticed a change to the layout of the drop and go. Please follow the direction of staff to ensure this flows as smoothly as possible.

Assembly

We will continue with separate assemblies for Years P-2 and Years 3-6 on Monday's at 2:20pm in the Worship Centre.

Primary School Worship

Our regular Worship time is 8.45am Friday for Prep to 2 but there are a few exceptions in the early weeks of Term One as outlined below. Years 3 to 6 Worship is scheduled for 9.30am every Friday with exceptions listed below.

- Bibles will be presented to all Year 3 students as well as students new to the College in Years 4-6 at 8.45am on Friday 3 February.
- Prep and new Years 1 and 2 students will have their Bible presentation at 8.45am Friday 10 February.
- Wednesday 22 February will be our Ash Wednesday service for all P-6 students.

We look forward to you joining us at these important College events.

Morning Program

In the Primary School, our morning program begins at 8.30am across Years P-6. Classes will generally be involved in Devotion, roll marking and general housekeeping matters prior to commencing the first formal lessons of the day. Further information will be given at your Parent Information Session. It is important that all students are at school **on time** each day, so that these sessions are not missed. Please ensure your child is at school by 8.25am ready to learn. School finishes for all Primary School year levels at 3.00pm.

Primary School Stationery

A reminder that no student exercise books require covering and / or book covers. Year 4 students (and new Years 5 and 6 students) are asked to buy an approved lock from the College Shop for your child's locker by 10 February. All students should have also brought in a pencil case for all their supplies and headphones that can be plugged into their iPad device.

Dress and Appearance

Hats are to be worn at all play times and **to and from school** each day. Please refer to the Uniform Schedule sent home for details of the pattern of wear. Students are required to present a note (or an email from their parent) to the Primary Administration requesting a uniform exemption should they be unable to wear a College uniform item for any reason.

Nut Allergies

As many families would be aware, we have several children in the Primary School with a **life-threatening** allergy to nuts. I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that peanut butter, Nutella, nuts and nut-based muesli bars are **not permitted** in the Primary School. Where possible, please also limit the number of other products sent to school containing traces of nuts. Your support in this is greatly appreciated.

OSHC (Outside School Hours Care)

OSHC is available from 6.30am to 8.00am and 3.00pm to 6.00pm each school day and 8.00am to 6.00pm during holiday periods. If you would like further information or need to enrol your child, please contact OSHC on T: 5477 3418 or oshc@immanuel.qld.edu.au.

Primary School ID Photos

Next Wednesday 1 February, all new Primary School students will have their ID photos taken for their library cards in the KTC. Students should come dressed in their regular timetabled uniform for a Thursday.

Medical and Consent Procedures and Student Contact Details

Please take time to login to SEQTA Engage, click on the "Finance & Contact Portal", then click on "My Details" and edit/update all medical, consent and contact details. This is done by selecting your child's name at the top of the screen. Please action this during Week 1 and also check the listed email contact details are current to ensure that communications such as newsletters are received throughout the year.

Communication

Please make a time to meet with your child's teacher should you need feedback regarding their journey at Immanuel. It is important that the **first point of contact regarding concerns be made with your child's teacher** as they are in the best position to support and intervene directly. College policy asks staff to respond to parent emails within two business days. That said, feel free to contact either Director of Wellbeing P-6 Mr Tim French, or myself, regarding any matters of concern should you feel the issue remains unresolved.

SEQTA Engage

From next Monday, Primary School parents will be able to access their child's curriculum outlines by logging on to SEQTA Engage. This portal also allows parents of students in Years 3 to 6 to view assessment feedback and track their child's learning journey from home. It is likely first academic results will be posted by teachers by the end of Week 4.

School Bus Transport 2023

CDC are now processing STAS (School Transport Assistance Scheme) school bus pass applications for the 2023 school year.

Parents/carers will only need to apply for a new school bus pass if their children are:

- Starting at a new school in 2023
- Moving into Year 7 at their current school in 2023
- Residing at a new address in 2023

Parents/carers will not need to apply for a school bus pass if their children are already bus pass holders and are (a) staying at the same school and (b) residing at the same address.

A warm welcome to all new and continuing families for 2023. By now you should have received your fee statement for Semester One. Fee statements were emailed to all families on Thursday 12 January with a due date no later than Friday 27 January 2023.

Payment of fees can be made by one of three methods:

- Pay the annual fees no later than Friday 27 January 2023 and receive an early payment discount;
- Pay the semester invoice no later than 27 January 2023; or
- Establish a weekly or fortnightly direct debit payment plan with the Business Office. All direct debit arrangements must be established prior to 27 January and completed by no later than Friday 10 November 2023.

The direct debit payment option is managed by the College and there is no additional cost to use this option for payment of fees.

- **Years 7-11 students** are to wear their House shirt, sports shorts, sports hat and sports shoes (thongs will not be permitted).
- Sunscreen is a must, as is a water bottle and healthy lunchbox. When participating in races, students will be provided with a swimming cap in their House colour and goggles are strongly advised. All students are to wear their ILC bathers, or bathers of a dark blue or black colour. Please note that two-piece bathers are not permitted, nor are bathers with a Brazilian or G-String style cut.
