ARTISTS ON THE HORIZON - YOUTH ART SHOWCASE

Entries are now open for the 2025 Artists on the Horizon, Youth Art Showcase to be held at Immanuel Lutheran College.

This showcase will focus on our talented young artists across the region, and will be held on Saturday 30 August, 2025, at A.J. Jericho Stadium, Immanuel Lutheran College, Buderim. The showcase will promote visual and creative art within the Sunshine Coast and surrounding communities.

School students from Prep to Year 12 from across the Sunshine Coast and surrounding regions are encouraged to participate in this exciting opportunity by entering their artwork that celebrates the incredible talent of young artists. So, if you're an Artist on the Horizon, don't miss out on the opportunity to showcase your talents to the public in a celebration of our younger generation. Entry is free for all students.

A total prize pool of \$3,000 with additional art supplies and art lesson vouchers donated by our sponsors will be awarded to the community favourite across each category.

An exhibition and sale of paintings, drawings, prints, sculpture, photography and wearable arts will be held at Immanuel Lutheran College, A. J. Jericho Stadium, 126-142 Wises Road, Buderim. The gallery will be open to the General Public from 10am to 5pm on Saturday 30 August, 2025, where all student artworks will be displayed. Gallery entry will be by gold coin donation. Winners will be announced throughout the day.

INSTRUCTIONS AND CONDITIONS

HOW TO ENTER

- Entrants must comply with all entry instructions and conditions.
- There is no entry fee;
- Bring a copy of the completed entry form along with the artwork to Immanuel Lutheran College on either Tuesday 26 August between 7am and 4.30 pm, or Wednesday 27 August, 2025 between 7am and 4.30pm. Further instructions will be emailed to entrants prior to these dates.
- Maximum three entries per student across any category/categories.

ELIGIBILITY:

The Artists on the Horizon youth art showcase is open to all school-aged children from Prep to Year 12 from the Sunshine Coast and surrounding regions.

AWARD CATEGORIES AND PRIZES:

There are five categories with the applicable age groups:

2D - Paintings, Drawings, and Mixed Media

Category age groups:

- Prep, Year 1, and Year 2 - 1st Prize \$50, 2nd Prize \$20
- Year 3 and Year 4 - 1st Prize \$60, 2nd Prize \$30
- Year 5 and Year 6 - 1st Prize \$80, 2nd Prize \$40
- Year 7 and Year 8 - 1st Prize \$100, 2nd Prize \$50
- Year 9 and Year 10 - 1st Prize \$150, 2nd Prize \$75
- Year 11 and Year 12 - 1st Prize \$200, 2nd Prize \$100
- Overall category Community favourite (as voted by the community): \$150 art supplies/lesson.

2D - Photography, Digital Art, and Digital Illustration

Category age groups:

- Prep, Year 1, and Year 2 - 1st Prize \$50, 2nd Prize \$20
- Year 3 and Year 4 - 1st Prize \$60, 2nd Prize \$30
- Year 5 and Year 6 - 1st Prize \$80, 2nd Prize \$40
- Year 7 and Year 8 - 1st Prize \$100, 2nd Prize \$50
- Year 9 and Year 10 - 1st Prize \$150, 2nd Prize \$75
- Year 11 and Year 12 - 1st Prize \$200, 2nd Prize \$100
- Overall category Community favourite (as voted by the community): \$150 art supplies/lesson.

3D Sculpture and Recycled Art

Category age groups:

- Prep to Year 12 - 1st Prize \$100, 2nd Prize \$50, community favourite (as voted by the community): \$150 art supplies/lesson voucher

Wearable Art

Category age groups:

- Prep to Year 12 - 1st Prize \$100, 2nd Prize \$50, community favourite (as voted by the community): \$150 art supplies/lesson voucher

Short Film

Category age groups:

- Prep to Year 12 - 1st Prize \$100, 2nd Prize \$50, community favourite (as voted by the community): \$150 art supplies/lesson voucher

ARTWORK REQUIREMENTS:

- Any art materials may be used (e.g., paint, pencil, pastels, collage, etc.)
- Must be original and not infringe the copyright, moral rights, or other rights of any third party
- Must be recent work created in the last 12 months
- Must be the original work and not a copy of the original work.
- Artwork must be the work of the child only and as such should not be welded, sawed, or drilled beyond what would be reasonably and safely expected from a supervised child of the intended age category.

SHORT FILM REQUIREMENTS:

- Films should be from 1-8 minutes long and must be submitted via the provided link by Thursday, August 21.
- Films must be submitted in .mp4 format, 1920 x 1080 (landscape), 25fps
- Films must be classified with an appropriate viewer rating (i.e., G, PG, M15+).
- The judge will assess each film against the criteria below:
- Cinematography – Picture composition, shot style, use of light or surroundings;
- Technical – Camera use, sound quality, use of music/FX, editing, props and costume;
- Story – Engaging, comprehensible, suitability to age category, and use of characters.
- only include students' first names in the credits
- be original works created in accordance with copyright laws
- include a poster to advertise the film that has been made

PREPARING THE ENTRY:

- All student artists must gain parent/guardian permission to enter the Showcase.
- Students can submit a maximum of 3 overall pieces in any category.
- Works created in any medium are accepted if they are non-perishable and not offensive.
- The selection of works to be exhibited will be entirely at the discretion of the Showcase Committee.

ENTRY FEES:

There is no fee to enter. We do not want to exclude any artists from entering and therefore have been able to fund the Showcase prizes from our generous sponsors.

SALES AND COMMISSIONS:

- Year 10, 11, and 12 students have the choice of submitting their artwork for sale.
- All artwork sales will incur a 10% commission which will be donated to The Friends of HEAL Foundation (HEAL), a unique charity providing Creative Arts Therapy in schools for traumatized refugee children in Queensland (www.healqld.com.au).
- If sold on the day, artists will be paid for their artwork by September 30, 2025, into their nominated bank account.

PUBLICITY:

Images of works submitted may be used for the purpose of advertising and marketing of current and future Showcases, including print and digital media.

MEDIA CONSENT:

By registering in the Artist on the Horizon youth art showcase the parent/guardian gives permission for Immanuel Lutheran College to collect media footage (photo/film/video/audio recording) of the entered artist and to use the media footage to publicly promote the Artists on the Horizon and its sponsors as follows:

- Irrevocably agree to the future use of the audio, photographic or video recordings of the entered child in connection with the Artists on the Horizon Showcase.
- Agree that Artists on the Horizon Showcase and its sponsors may use the various media in whole or in part for, but not limited to, general and organisational wide project specific marketing and publicity purposes.
- Images may be used for printed collateral or for electronic and online content.
- Neither the parent/guardian nor the registered child will receive any financial payment or reimbursement for any time and/or expenses incurred as a result of our participation.
- The dignity and integrity of the individuals involved will be maintained at all times.

LIABILITY:

If a student is concerned about the security of their entry, please indicate the care that should be taken on the entry form, especially for fragile works requiring special handling.

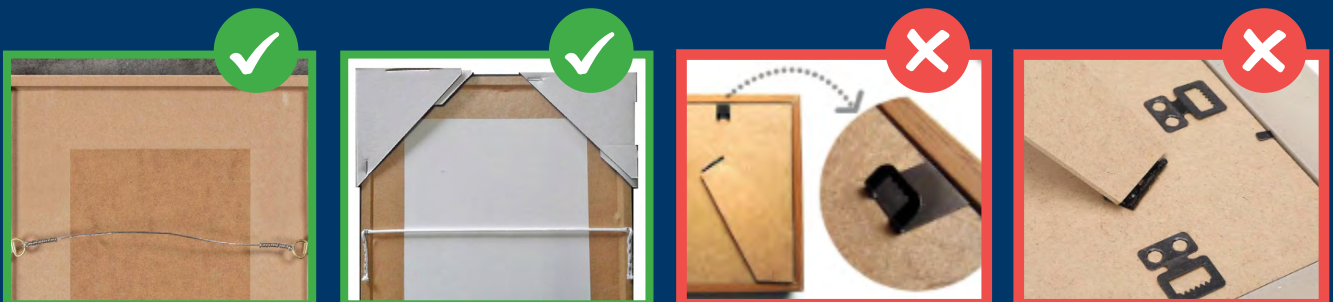
ARTWORK IDENTIFICATION AND PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

IDENTIFICATION/LABELLING:

- The work must be accompanied by a printout of the completed entry form.
- The 'Attached to artwork' section of the entry form emailed to the entrant must be printed and firmly stuck to the back of hanging artwork, or bottom for standing artwork. Artworks cannot be accepted without this form being securely stuck to the artwork.

PRESENTATION OF ARTWORK:

- Students are asked NOT to present their artwork in glass frames but should be mounted on card, canvas, or a glassless frame (to align with OH&S policies).
- If work is presented on stretched canvas or glassless frame, a wire or cord must be securely attached to the back of the artwork to allow the artwork to be hung on a hook.
- Artworks in Recycled Waste Art prize can be 2D or 3D but should be no bigger than A3 in size or 40cm in any direction. Work that is not sturdy enough for display can cause harm to others (i.e., sharp edges) or is offensive may not be exhibited.
- All work must be completely clean and dry when delivered.



DELIVERY AND COLLECTION OF ARTWORK:

- Delivery must be made in-person. Deliveries will not be accepted via Australia Post.
- Entries will only be accepted during the specified delivery period.
- Do NOT roll or fold the artwork. We suggest placing it between two pieces of cardboard for delivery to protect it and keep it flat.
- All artwork is to be delivered to Immanuel Lutheran College during the following times:
 - Tuesday 26 August, 2025 between 7am and 4.30pm
 - Wednesday 27 August, 2025 between 7am and 4.30pm
- An email will be sent closer to the event with full details for delivery.
- No late deliveries will be accepted.
- No works may be removed prior to the conclusion of the event.
- Short Film entries must be sent via the provided link by Thursday 21 August, 2025.
- Unsold and NOT FOR SALE works must be collected on Saturday 30 August, from 5pm to 6.30pm..
- Any artwork not collected will be at risk of being damaged due to being unable to store the artwork. The Showcase Committee will not pay for damage to work that occurs after Saturday 30 August 2025. There will be no returns by Australia Post.

JUDGING:

- The judge's decision will be final and no subsequent discussion will be entered into.
- Two winning entries for each Category group in the Artists on the Horizon Student Art Showcase 2025 (representing each age category as per the schedule) will be selected by the independent judges. There will also be one overall community choice award as voted for by the public. The public can place votes throughout the exhibition day from 10.30am to 3:30 pm.
- Prize winners will be announced on the day at the main stage.

CARE AND RESPONSIBILITY:

Immanuel Lutheran College P&F Committee will exercise all reasonable care with the artworks submitted for Artists on the Horizon. However, it does not insure them against damage or theft; this is the responsibility of the artist.

COPYRIGHT:

The student must be the sole author and owner of the copyright of artwork entered. Immanuel Lutheran College reserves the right to photograph/scan all artworks entered in the Artists on the Horizon Youth Art Showcase for the purpose of documentation and promotion.

INTERPRETATION OF RULES:

In the event of a dispute regarding the interpretation of the rules and conditions, the decision of the Immanuel Lutheran College P&F Committee shall be binding on all parties.
